GFI and CDOT have been working on testing and implementing interventions for improving the viability of BC agents and include more women BCs in the network in Bihar under the BEADS Project since 2020. The project introduced new micro-savings products, low-cost customer awareness methods, change management, and the use of innovative technologies to empower customers and agents, especially women. The Jazbe ko Salaam event was an extension of this initiative, aimed at recognizing and honoring the contributions of women BC agents.

According to RR Kalyan, CEO of CDOT, "The BC network has been a game-changer in the banking sector, particularly in rural areas, where it has helped to bridge the gap between the unbanked population and the formal financial system. However, the majority of BC agents are men, and women are often excluded from this network due to social, cultural, and economic barriers. The BEADS project has been working to address this gap, and the Jazbe ko Salaam event is a testament to the success of this initiative."

Echoing similar sentiments, Piyush Singh, Director, Digital Finance, Grameen Foundation India, said, "We are delighted to honor these exceptional women BC agents who have broken through gender and social barriers to make a meaningful contribution to their communities. Through the BEADS project, we have been working to create a more inclusive and sustainable BC network, and we are committed to continuing such efforts to empower more women and drive financial inclusion across the country."
